Bilingual Nurse Practitioner, COVID-19 Response & Recovery (part time)
0.5 FTE (17.5 hours/week)

South-East Ottawa Community Health Centre (SEOCHC) is a non-profit, community-governed organization that provides a range of multi-disciplinary services to clients, including primary care, health promotion, social services, community and resource development, home support and advocacy to address the social determinants of health. SEOCHC particularly responds to persons who face barriers to accessing health and social services and who live in South-East Ottawa. Our services and programs are designed to meet the needs of our community.

SEOCHC has been working hard for the past two years responding to the needs of the community during the COVID-19 pandemic. The work continues as we build back in supporting our marginalized communities. Our goal is to continue to increase access to testing, vaccines, and antiviral treatment. At the same time, providing access to community mental health, primary care and preventive care and support in addressing the social determinants of health. Therefore, this role will be bringing services primarily to our communities in their backyard.

Our COVID-19 Recovery & Response Team is seeking a part-time Nurse Practitioner to provide care in the community in our efforts in supporting COVID-19 response and recovery. This role will work in collaboration with an interprofessional team, in the community and support clients in accessing services available across the Centre. Travel will be required across the city for this position.

Due to the pandemic, we conduct daily infection prevention screening of all clients and staff coming to our Centre to help prevent exposures to COVID-19. We provide both virtual and face-to-face visits to our clients including evenings and weekends, however this position will require you to be face-to-face with clients in various community settings.

South-East Ottawa Community Health Center requires **ALL** employees to be **Fully Vaccinated against Covid-19**. Individuals who cannot be vaccinated due to **substantiated grounds** (medical and other protected grounds under the Ontario Human Rights Code) **may ask South-East Ottawa Community Health Centre to validate the exemption** and request an accommodation for these rare circumstances. If approved, they will be subject to additional health and safety measures.

Requirements:

- Registered with the College of Nurses of Ontario – Extended class
- Minimum two years' experience as a nurse practitioner providing primary care in a community setting
- Strong clinical skills and diagnostic abilities: Performs medical examinations and evaluations, diagnoses, treatment, follow-up, consultation and health education
- Effective organizational, critical thinking, problem-solving and decision-making skills
- Excellent communication skills and ability to adapt communication styles to meet the needs of clients, health team members and community partners
- Experience working with low-income families, children, youth, seniors, multicultural and diverse populations
- Experience working with a diverse interprofessional care team.
- Knowledge and understanding of the Community Health Centre model of health and well-being.
- Demonstrated understanding of the impact of the social determinants of health on people's health and well-being.
- Fluency in English and French language preferred; other languages an asset
- Proficiency in the use of computers and electronic medical records, particularly PS Suites
- Ability to work flexible hours
- Proof of Vaccination against COVID-19 required
- Recent Police Record Check for the Vulnerable Sector required
- Must have a valid driver's license and own mode of transportation
- Basic Life Support for health care provider
