Job Description IWSO Board Member

Statement of Responsibility

The Board of Directors is the legal authority for Immigrant Women Services Ottawa (IWSO). As a member of the Board, a Director acts in a position of trust and is responsible for the effective governance of the organization.

The Board of Directors emphasize:

- Strategic leadership and its fiduciary responsibility;
- Clarification between the Board and staff roles;
- Social justice, anti-oppression, and equality for all women.

Duties

- Attend Board meetings up to 8 times per year (every other month)
- Participate on at least one Board Committee
- Review and amend the vision, mission and objectives of the agency as deemed necessary
- Review and amend the By-Laws and operational policies and procedures
- Participate in the implementation of IWSO's Strategic Plan
- Define and review programs and services within the policy framework of IWSO.

Qualifications

- A strong commitment to the vision, mission, mandate and values of IWSO
- Demonstrated leadership skills
- An understanding of the issues affecting immigrant women
- An understanding of the Violence Against Women and Settlement & Integration Sectors
- A commitment of approximately 5 hours per month
- Ability to contribute to strengthening the financial base of IWSO
- Able to offer lived experience as a newcomer to Canada, survivor of violence, or both
- Ability to communicate well in English.

Term

Directors serve a two-year term and may be elected for an additional two consecutive terms for a total of 6 years.
